OVERVIEW

Hudson is a fast-growing small city with a big heart, and we are looking for a motivated, dependable Public Works Technician to join our municipal team. This hands-on position supports the reliable operation of the City's wastewater infrastructure and helps protect public health and the environment.

The position primarily focuses on the operation, maintenance, repair, and construction of wastewater facilities, including the treatment plant, lift stations, and sewer lines. The technician will also assist with city streets and other public facilities as needed.

ESSENTIAL RESPONSIBILITIES

- Operate and monitor wastewater treatment equipment, including pumps, valves, and control systems.
- Inspect, maintain, troubleshoot, and repair wastewater collection and treatment infrastructure.
- Collect and document data related to wastewater quality, process performance, and system efficiency.
- Operate loaders, backhoes, tankers, and other heavy equipment used in construction, repair, and maintenance activities.
- Install, troubleshoot, and repair piping, plumbing fixtures, pumps, and mechanical components.
- Assist with sewer-line, lift-station, and other infrastructure construction projects.
- Perform basic calculations, review operating trends, and help troubleshoot system issues.
- Maintain accurate operational logs, maintenance records, and equipment repair documentation.
- Follow all safety procedures when working around heavy equipment, hazardous materials, confined spaces, and physically demanding conditions.
- Assist with maintenance of city streets, rights-of-way, and other public facilities as assigned.

MINIMUM REQUIREMENTS

- High school diploma or equivalent.
- Valid driver's license at the time of hire.
- Ability to obtain a Texas Wastewater Class C license in accordance with TCEQ eligibility and licensing requirements.
- Mechanical aptitude and the ability to learn or work with pumps, valves, piping systems, and general equipment repair.
- Ability to safely operate or learn to operate loaders, backhoes, tankers, and other construction equipment.
- Ability to perform regular heavy lifting and other physically demanding work while following safety standards.
- Strong problem-solving skills, attention to detail, dependability, and the ability to respond effectively to operational issues.
- Availability for emergency call-outs on nights and weekends as needed.

PREFERRED QUALIFICATIONS

- Texas Wastewater Class C license issued by the Texas Commission on Environmental Quality (TCEQ).
- Texas Commercial Driver License (CDL).
- Technical training or experience in wastewater treatment, utilities, construction, plumbing, mechanical repair, or a related field.
